**RE:** CalWORKs 2020-21 Allocation Memo

This memo provides allocation budget information for the 2020-21 fiscal year (FY). The Chancellor's Office allocates ongoing funding for the California Work Opportunity and Responsibility to Kids (CalWORKs) categorical program exclusively for the education and training services for county cash aid recipients. FY 2020-21 Prop 98 appropriations consist of \$32.393 million for CalWORKs Program funding, \$5.060 million for Work Study funding and \$9.488 million for Child Care funding. Additionally, \$8.0 million has been appropriated in federal Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) from the California Department of Social Services.

The funding methodology for CalWORKs and TANF remains unchanged. Both Butte College and Santa Rosa Junior College were held harmless at 2017-18 enrollment levels to align with the emergency conditions applied to general apportionment funding as a result of wild fires.

Please see the attached Allocation document for college allocation amounts. Colleges are encouraged to continue to monitor the State budget for any changes that may occur in the Fall. Business offices are advised that an adjustment to the amount certified in the Advance apportionment period will be updated to reflect the allocation spreadsheet attached. Additionally, this year the payment schedule will be accelerated such that districts receive 100% of the CalWORKs allocation by January 2021.

Colleges are required to submit a proposed budget plan in the Student Services Automated Reporting for Community Colleges (SSARCC) web application by November 2, 2020.
