Successful Hornet Student Leadership Virtual Retreat

The Hornet Student Leadership Virtual Retreat had 57 total student participants for the first virtual retreat, with a total of 66 people including staff/faculty. 75 students initially signed up. 60 of those students were returning FC students, 15 of the students were new to FC with fall semester being their first semester.

The guidelines include wearing a mask and rescheduling a flu shot appointment if experiencing symptoms of COVID-19, such as fever, headache, and/or cough.
