The Transfer Center Records 12,370 Student Contacts, and Served 851 (unduplicated) Students from Dec. 1 through Jan. 31.

Winter was a busy time for the Transfer Center, as we assisted our fall transfer applicants with their application updates and began outreach efforts to our 2024 transfers. From Dec. 1 through Jan. 31, we recorded 12,370 student contacts and served 851 (unduplicated) students.


Replenishing The Hanger: Donate to FC's Career Closet


